MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD CHAIR

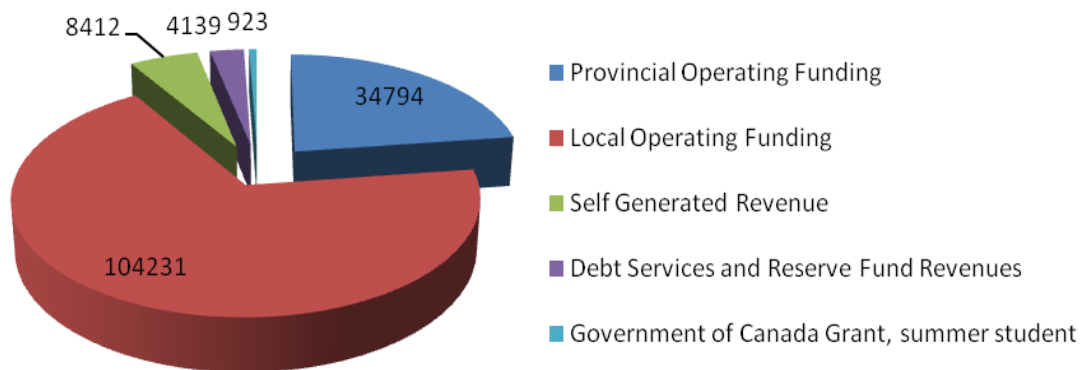

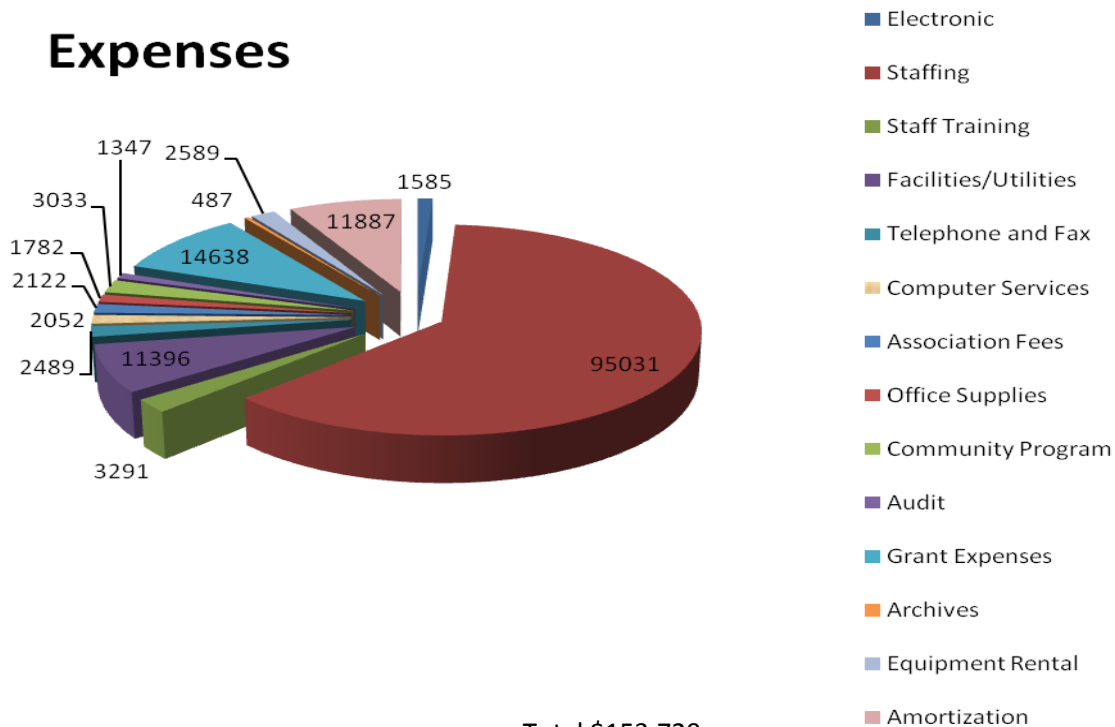
